The course has five mindsets: 1. ESG (governance criteria) 2. Digital (AI) 3. Entrepreneurship (DNA), 4. Multiculturalism (Inter-campus mobility) 5. Cross-field skills.

The Bachelor in Management (BSc) allows students to become experts in management science and learn how to make complex decisions. While exploring humanities, they practice how to deal with people and lead teams. Students gain valuable hands-on business management experience with a focus on working as a team and cross-cultural communication through internships and social impact projects. The active learning pedagogy and multinational teamwork, together successfully prepare students for truly international careers.
