She is a founding member and President of ALFA BUSINESS FORUM ARGENTINE FRANCE.

She is regularly interviewed by the media on Latin American issues.

She is a regular speaker on geopolitical issues and relations between the EU and Latin America to senior executives (Executive MBA, European immersion seminars, etc.). At IRIS Institut des Relations internationales et stratégiques, she teaches the course *Analyzing Latin America-Europe relations in the contemporary geopolitical context*, as part of the "Analyst in International Strategy" program, Geoeconomics, Risk Management and Corporate Responsibility track.
